


# Introducing the International Speakers for Highlander's 84th Anniversary Homecoming

Peggy Antrobus, from the Caribbean, has worked at national, regional and international levels, within and outside mainstream institutions. She has been involved in the establishment of a number of agencies and organisations including the Women's Bureau in the Office of the Prime Minister of Jamaica (1974), the Caribbean Association for Feminist Action and Research (CAFRA) (1981), and Development Alternatives with Women for a New Era (DAWN), a network of feminist scholars and activists from the Economic South (1985). Her book, *The Global Women's Movement: Origins, Issues and Strategies*, was published in 2004.

Chimère Diaw has lived and worked in Senegal, the United States, Canada, Indonesia and Cameroon. He is the Director General of the African Model Forest Network (AMFN) and a member of the International Networking Committee of the IMFN (International Model Forest Network). Chimère has led or contributed to several international programs on Adaptive Collaborative Management, Governance, Verification, Environmental Services and Rural Livelihoods, Alternative to Slash and Burn, Environmental Decentralizations and Criteria and Indicators of Sustainable Forest Management.



Aimee Santos-Lyons cut her organizing teeth in the Philippines working with urban poor community women leaders who stared down bulldozers to fight for land security and economic rights. Aimee brings nearly two decades of both U.S. and international experience in both social development and humanitarian concerns, with a special emphasis on gender equity, violence prevention, reproductive health, rights and justice work.
